**HP.1 GENERAL INFORMATION**

Historic preservation is a major consideration at the University of Virginia. The Historic District consists of 94 buildings within the Central Grounds area including Thomas Jefferson’s Academical Village, and are considered historic landmarks. In addition, many other buildings are classified as historic landmarks or components of designated historic districts. The following is a list of historic buildings within the University. The Academical Village is listed separately as illustrated also in **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS Fig. GR-3**.

**HP.2      ARCHAEOLOGICAL CONCERNS**

The University has from time to time discovered subsurface archaeological materials requiring immediate and expedient investigation as to their merits and the means by which they will be removed and/or preserved.

It is the University's responsibility to advise the Architect/Engineer of known or potential sites having archaeological significance, as well the intent of the University to perform an archaeological investigation. The Architect/Engineer shall request confirmation from the Project Manager.

In the event of a discovery during construction, the Project Manager will make provisions for site investigation.
